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Information about the Environment and for travellers in Crete:

Platani

an abandoned village in the southeast of Crete,
 with still well-kept Chapel Agios Nikolaos



You reach the village from Goudouras toward Agia Triada. After a few miles you come to a crossing, at which you can drive both on the right and left to Agia Triada. Here we took the left branch according to the sign-posting (see fig.). After about 1 mile we reached the village ruins, right and left of the road; the today still maintained chapel of the formerly inhabited place is located on the right of the road.

Google coordinates: N 35°01' 41.8; E 26°07' 07.3.

It is scarcely anything to find out about this former village; however the building method and some architectural elements point to the Venetian time, possibly also Byzantine. Some hardly intact premises are how-



ever still used today occasionally as overnight accommodation by olive harvest hand. The chapel also still serves for Easter celebrations or at the St. Nicholas' day; an inhabitant from Agia Triada feels here responsible and maintains the chapel, which is always open.
